The activity was structured in such a way that it promoted an informal exchange of knowledge, ideas, and perceptions among the participants. Teams presented their works-in-progress to their peers and instructors, receiving constructive feedback for further refinement. This emphasized the importance of audience engagement and iterative content creation. The culmination of the week was a group discussion session where students presented their finished projects to a broader audience, including faculty, industry professionals, and the local community. The platform catered to the diverse formats – an interactive website hosted podcasts, videos, and data visualizations, alongside live Q&A sessions on social media. The final year students of J&MC participated in this learning activity very effectively.

Learning Outcomes:

The third year BA(JMC) course Basics of New Media (301) & New Media Lab (351) offered students a chance to comprehend the creation process and all its complexities. Overall, this activity provided a valuable platform for journalism students to develop essential skills and apply their knowledge of new media in a practical and engaging setting. The following are the outcomes that the students attained:

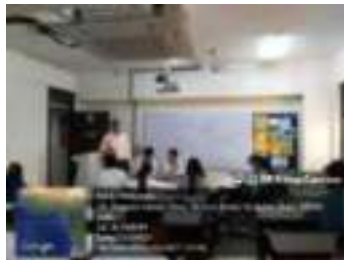
