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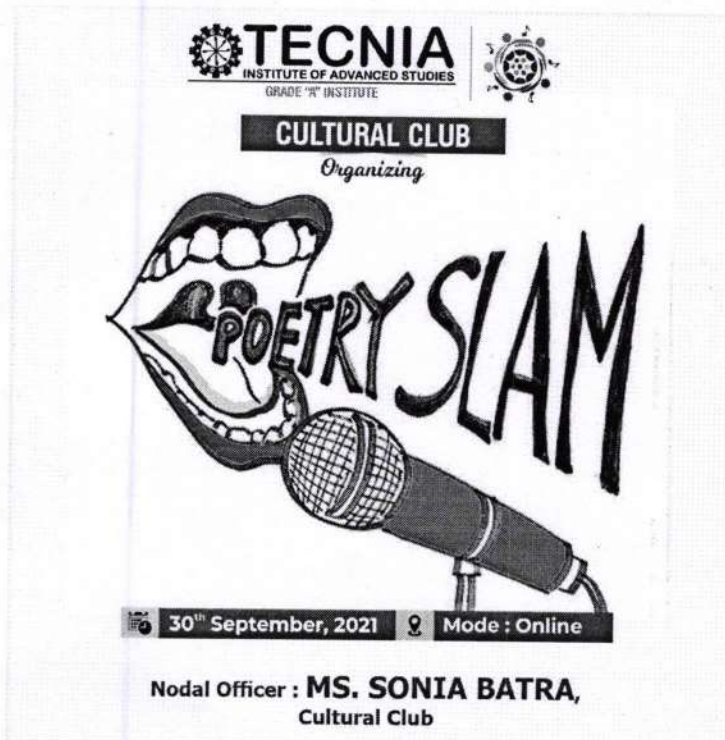

Introduction to Poetry Slams

A poetry slam is a competitive event where poets perform original works of poetry, which are then judged by a panel or the audience based on content, delivery, and style. Originating in the 1980s in Chicago, poetry slams have grown into a global phenomenon, offering a platform for poets to express their thoughts on social, political, and personal issues. The format encourages dynamic performance, blending literary art with elements of theatre and public speaking.

The primary objective of poetry slams is to provide a platform for diverse voices to be heard, especially those that may be marginalized or underrepresented in mainstream media. Poetry slams challenge traditional notions of poetry by emphasizing performance and accessibility, allowing poets to engage with their audience on a deeper, more personal level.

Creative writing skill writing and performing slam poetry helps students develop their writing skills, particularly in crafting concise, powerful narratives and arguments.

Confidence in public speaking the experience of performing in front of an audience builds confidence, which is essential for anyone aspiring to work in journalism or mass communication.
