








**Report: Description in (min 250 to max 800 words)\***

As a part of its community engagement and rural development initiatives, the **NSS Cell of Tecnia Institute of Advanced Studies** organized a **community outreach programme in Village Khampur**, North-West Delhi, on **18 November 2024 at 1 PM**. The event aimed to create awareness, distribute basic learning materials, and provide a platform for interaction and knowledge exchange between urban youth and rural communities.

This initiative was aligned with the **National Service Scheme's motto: "Not Me, But You"**, emphasizing the importance of selfless service and national development through grassroots-level participation. A total of **12 NSS student volunteers**, under the guidance of faculty members, participated in the drive with enthusiasm and commitment.

**Preparation and Planning**

Prior to the event, the NSS team conducted a reconnaissance visit to Village Khampur to understand the local needs, demographic composition, and social challenges. Based on the findings, the team prepared an action plan that focused on three key areas:

1. **Education and Awareness:** Conducting sessions for children and parents on the importance of education, hygiene, and

digital literacy.

2. **Distribution of Essentials:** Distributing notebooks, pens, and hygiene kits to children and women.
3. **Community Interaction:** Holding informal dialogues with local residents to understand their issues and aspirations.

The volunteers prepared educational material, posters, and leaflets. Kits containing stationery items, sanitary napkins, soaps, and masks were packed and labelled by the students in the days leading up to the event.

### **Execution of the Event**

The volunteers reached Village Khampur by noon and began setting up the interaction space near the Panchayat Bhawan. The programme formally started at **1:00 PM** with a brief introduction by the NSS Programme Officer, who highlighted the objectives of the initiative and welcomed the villagers to participate actively.

The event unfolded in the following segments:

#### **1. Educational Session for Children**

NSS volunteers conducted an engaging session for **school-going and out-of-school children**, using storytelling, visual aids, and simple demonstrations to highlight:

- The importance of regular school attendance
- Cleanliness and personal hygiene
- Staying safe online and offline

Children were encouraged to ask questions and express their thoughts. The volunteers gifted them **stationery kits** which included notebooks, pencils, erasers, and drawing sheets to motivate their interest in learning. A drawing activity was also organized, where children enthusiastically participated and showcased their creativity.

#### **2. Women's Health and Hygiene Awareness**

A separate session was held with the women of the village to discuss the often-overlooked topic of **menstrual hygiene and general health practices**. Volunteers sensitively handled the conversation, using posters and leaflets to explain the importance of using sanitary products and maintaining cleanliness during menstruation.

Each woman participant was provided with a **sanitary hygiene kit** consisting of sanitary napkins, soaps, and basic health information pamphlets. The session concluded with a group discussion where women shared their concerns, and the volunteers assured them of continued support and awareness efforts.

### **3. Cleanliness Drive and Waste Awareness**

In line with the **Swachh Bharat Mission**, the NSS team also conducted a short **cleanliness drive** around the village school and community center. The volunteers collected plastic waste, cleaned up common areas, and educated local children about the importance of waste segregation and using dustbins.

Placards with slogans like *“Keep Your Village Clean”* and *“My Clean Village, My Pride”* were displayed, and some were handed over to community leaders to promote sustainable behavior beyond the event.

### **Community Engagement and Response**

The villagers of Khampur welcomed the NSS team warmly and actively participated in the sessions. Children were excited and happy to receive the educational kits, and many of them expressed their dreams of becoming teachers, doctors, or police officers. Women appreciated the open discussion on hygiene and requested more such sessions in the future.

The sarpanch and local elders extended their gratitude to the Tecnia Institute and suggested developing a regular outreach program to address literacy and health gaps in the village.

### **Learning Outcomes**


The event had a positive impact on both the **beneficiaries** and the **student volunteers**. While the villagers received much-needed resources and information, the volunteers:

- Developed a deeper understanding of rural realities and socio-economic challenges
- Strengthened their leadership, communication, and planning skills
- Experienced the transformative power of education and awareness
- Learned the importance of empathy, respect, and cultural sensitivity

### **Conclusion**

The outreach programme at **Village Khampur**, organized by the **NSS Cell of Tecnia Institute of Advanced Studies**, was a heartfelt step toward **bridging the rural-urban divide**. It promoted education, hygiene, and environmental awareness while fostering community engagement and volunteer spirit among students.

The event highlighted that **small actions, when rooted in compassion and sincerity, can bring about meaningful change**. The NSS unit aims to continue its service efforts by organizing follow-up visits and expanding its outreach in nearby villages to build a more informed, healthy, and inclusive society.
