


Report on Sadbhavana Day

<p>Report: Description in (min 250 to max 800 words)*</p>	<p>The debate saw active participation from over 19 students, representing different departments of the institute. Each participant had the opportunity to present their stance either for or against the motion, with a time limit of 3 minutes each. The competition was judged by faculty coordinator of the Cultural Club at Tecnia Institute of Advanced Studies.</p> <p>The arguments raised during the debate ranged from the historical foundations of secularism in India to contemporary issues such as communalism, political narratives, and the role of religion in governance. Some participants argued passionately that India continues to uphold its secular values, pointing to constitutional safeguards, legal protections, and the peaceful coexistence of diverse communities. Others raised concerns about recent trends that challenge the secular fabric, such as religious intolerance, caste-based discrimination, and the politicization of religious identities.</p>


