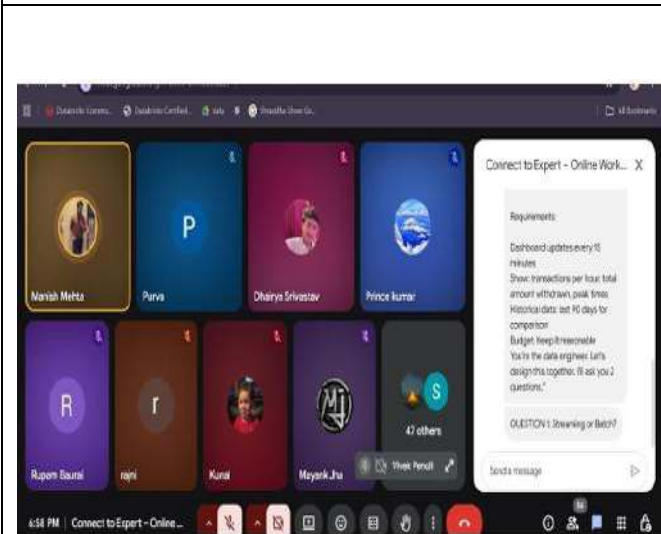

The rapid advancement of Artificial Intelligence has transformed the technological landscape, influencing decision-making, communication, automation, and data-driven processes across sectors. However, alongside these developments arise significant ethical challenges related to accountability, transparency, bias, privacy, and social impact. Recognizing the importance of value-based technological growth, the Indian Knowledge Systems (IKS) Cell, in collaboration with the Department of Information, Communication and Technology (DICT), organized an Online Lecture on **“AI, Ethics, and Indian Philosophical Thought.”**

The lecture aimed to bridge ancient Indian philosophical wisdom with contemporary ethical debates surrounding Artificial Intelligence. The resource person began by highlighting the relevance of Indian philosophical concepts such as **Dharma (righteous duty), Karma (action and consequence), Ahimsa (non-violence), Satya**


(truth), and Lokasangraha (welfare of society)

in understanding ethical responsibilities in AI development and deployment. These principles provide a holistic ethical framework that complements modern technological ethics.

The session elaborated on how Indian philosophy emphasizes human-centered thinking, moral responsibility, and harmony between technology and society. The discussion addressed ethical issues such as algorithmic bias, misuse of data, automation-driven unemployment, and the need for transparent AI systems. Participants were encouraged to reflect on how AI systems should align with societal welfare rather than mere efficiency or profit.

The lecture further emphasized the relevance of **IKS in ICT education**, advocating for interdisciplinary learning where technology students are sensitized to ethical reasoning and cultural values. Through real-life examples and philosophical insights, the session demonstrated how Indian Knowledge Systems can guide responsible innovation and sustainable digital practices.

The interactive session concluded with a question-and-answer segment where participants actively engaged in discussions on ethical AI policies, digital governance, and the role of educational institutions in promoting value-based technology education. The lecture successfully created awareness about the necessity of integrating ethics and philosophy into AI research, development, and implementation.
